Alimony Eligibility in Georgia Courts

Georgia law provides general guidelines for determining alimony without any specific formula. An award of alimony is based on one spouse's needs and the other spouse's ability to pay. The courts consider the unique circumstances of each couple in each case. Our experienced attorneys can help you focus on the factors most helpful to you in determining a fair amount of alimony for your case. Some of the factors that the court will consider include the following:

- Earning capacity of each spouse
- Financial resources available to each spouse
- Contributions each spouse made to the marriage and family
- Standard of living enjoyed by each spouse during the marriage
- Length of the marriage
- Age of each spouse
- Conduct of each spouse during the marriage, including causes of the breakup of the marriage

Not every divorce in Georgia includes an order for alimony. Whether you receive alimony and the amount ordered is discretionary in Georgia. The BKBM family law team is a strong advocate for our clients whether in settlement negotiations or at hearings and trial.

Tax Consequences of Alimony

The IRS views alimony as income. Therefore, the payor is permitted to deduct spousal support from taxable income. Conversely, the recipient must report the amount of support on federal income tax returns. Except under specific conditions, the IRS does not allow individuals to deduct division of assets as a loss.
